CRIME IS REVOLTING

Martin Sisters 9 and 11 Met Death At Hands of Fiend Charged Defendant

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 28.—(United Press)—One of the most sordid tragedies in Los Angeles criminal annals is to be unfolded in superior court here Monday when S. C. Stone, 65 year old step-father of Jack Hoxie, goes on trial charged with the murder of May and Nina Martin, school girls.

Alleged Slayer To Go on Trial

Stone, already under arrest in connection with alleged attacks on small children, was grilled mercilessly for weeks, denying repeatedly he had any knowledge of the Martin case. Recently he was indicted. A week ago state's attorneys announced that he had made a partial confession. Stone, however, continued to deny the charges against him, and asserted the alleged confession was a "frame-up."

Sum of \$3,000 to Be Given For Ridding District of Predatory Animals
