One of the big Portland buyers received a wire from Boston connections, saying that because of the easier trend there, no purchases should be made until so advised by eastern connections. This is taken to indicate a more cautious trend in the American trade as a result of late declines in southern hemisphere markets.

### SPORTS DONE BROWN

I think that the "bawling out" Coach Bob Zuppke administered to "Red" Grange at the annual dinner of the University of Illinois football team the other night was ill advised and a direct insult to the greatest football player that has ever graced a team of that institution.

Whatever views Zuppke or his associates had or felt concerning the decision of Grange regarding professional football should have been forgotten on that occasion.

That dinner is held for the purpose of paying due homage to the men who each fall risk their physical well being by playing football for the honor and glory of the Illinois. Grange, by his great work, had written a more brilliant chapter than any other player who had gone before him.

Grange had faithfully accomplished what Zuppke had set out to have him do—bring fame to Illinois.

Illinois, with the other colleges, long before Grange's debut, had decided that football was the road to nation-wide publicity, popularity and increased enrollment. Grange, when he appeared as a candidate, was simply a bit of material which Zuppke and his aides hoped to use in molding a team that would bring more prominence to Illinois.

Grange risked life and limb—one must realize that there is still some danger of injury in football—to further Zuppke's ends and received in return—the plaudits of the multitude, sub-consciously a lesson in loyalty, a well developed physique and a varsity "I."

No doubt competent instructors could have instilled ideas of loyalty and built his physique without using football had the desire been there.

But in no other way could the college authorities have derived so much benefit for the institution as they did by training Grange to be a ball player.

### STANFORD PROF. TO FLIRT WITH GHOSTS

PALO ALTO, Calif., Dec. 2.—Ghosts are coming in for the serious attention of Professor John E. Coover of the Stanford university psychology department.

Experimental investigation is being made of various forms of psychic phenomena, in an attempt to discover the exact relationship between the so-called spiritual world and scientific knowledge.

Professor Coover believes most of the ghosts seen have been merely sensory illusions, excited by an active imagination put into action by a certain outline of sound. He will endeavor to test, by actual experiment, the verity of these beliefs and to observe how far the senses are influenced when "ghosts" and similar apparitions are reported.

### COLUMBIA SAID TO FAVOR ANDY SMITH

NEW YORK, Dec. 2.—(United News)—Columbia university, considering a change of football coaches for 1926, is wondering whether Andy Smith, who has had success with the University of California eleven in recent years, will accept \$15,000 a year for three seasons, and come east to instruct the gridiron squad on Morningstar heights.

No official announcement has been made, as Charley Crowley, the present mentor of the Lions, has not resigned.
