

# BASKET BALL TO START AT K. H. S.

### Regular Practice to Start Immediately After the Christmas Holidays

On Saturday morning, December 12, at 10 o'clock in the Medford high school, the schools of southern Oregon, including Klamath, will meet to arrange a Southern Oregon Basketball league schedule. In years past the winner of southern Oregon met the winner of the Klamath county league. This has been reversed, however, and Klamath will have active participation with the valley teams during the winter.

Whether or not the old custom of winner playing winner is observed will be definitely decided during the meeting next week. Klamath will be represented at Medford by Principals Paul Jackson and Coach Dwight French.

Active coaching of basketball will not open until January 4, when school is resumed after the holidays. However, Monday "skull practice" will be called when Coach French will bring the boys out for basketball practice three times a week to go through the science of the game.

Principal Jackson is in receipt of a letter from the Bend high school asking for a basketball game on December 12.

"It is impossible for us to accept this game," said Jackson yesterday. "Our boys have not had the practice the Bend boys have had and we are doubly handicapped until after the completion of the Leavenworth building, as we are without a gym in which to practice. We declined the game with sincere regret."

### Authorities Break Chicago Bomb Trust

CHICAGO, Dec. 4. (United News.)—Authorities believe they have broken the back of the "bomb trust" that has gained a strangle hold on many small businesses and trade unions here.

The special grand jury investigating the campaign of explosive intimidation, completed its work Friday evening by voting 15 more true bills. Fifty leaders of the "trust" have now been indicted.

Bombings have fallen off sharply since the quiz began.

Next week the regular grand jury will take up the investigation where the special grand jury left off. More indictments are certain. Gangsters, versed in the art of the professional terrorist, have induced dry cleaners, bakers, laundrymen, cobblers, dyers and fruit and vegetable dealers to join the "association for mutual benefit." Once a nucleus of joiners is obtained the leaders proceeded with bombs against the establishments of those who declined to join.

One hundred and nineteen stores and homes have been blown up in Chicago already this year. Often windows were smashed as an initial warning. If this violence proved ineffective the entire business establishment may be wrecked by a bomb.

### Women Would Place Ban on Gin Shakers

KANSAS CITY, Dec. 4. (United News.)—Cocktail shakers, flasks and other accessories of tipping, are too much of a temptation to flaming youth, and should be removed from the windows of merchants who are showing Christmas gifts. A resolution adopted at the meeting of the Kansas City federation of the W. C. T. U., made public Thursday, favors requesting all merchants to refrain from selling and displaying these articles.

Many downtown windows will be barred if merchants acquiesce to the women's request.

### MURDERER GLAD JURY FINDS HIM NOT INSANE

LEAVENWORTH, Kas., Dec. 4. (United News.)—"Thank you, gentlemen." These were the words with which John Black late Thursday received the verdict of first degree murder returned by a jury following his trial for the killing of an aged miner.

Three physicians and the defense attorneys had contended that Black was insane. Black himself, and the jury thought otherwise. "I am glad you found me guilty instead of crazy," he told the court. "Now I will go to Lansing, stay a while, and get out. It would have taken a dozen doctors to get me out of an asylum."
