PORTLAND, Dec. 4.—(United News)—Ake versus "pill" smokers. Fred U. Robins, 60-year-old hiker, who believes he can out-walk and out-last any cigarette smoker, has issued a challenge to tobacco inhalers of all ages for a 48-mile hike.

So far only two of the addicts have been entered in the contest, but entrants from the University of Oregon medical school—to which Robins' challenge was directed—are expected to sign up.

The two bonafide contestants are C. W. Stagg, shoe salesman, and John Bryan, both former soldiers. Stagg was the first to accept the challenge, and declares cigarettes will have no ill effect on his trading ability. He is no hiker, he admits, but his friends point to his 18 months on the line in France, and sigh for Robins.

The issue was raised in a letter from Robins to a Portland newspaper, in which he decried the smoking habit of students at the medical school, and insisted despite his sixty years, he could out-walk any younger man addicted to cigarettes.

TICKNOR WOULD ADOPT NEW TAX PAYMENT PLAN

If taxpayers had the opportunity to pay their taxes in small installments it would tend to diminish delinquencies.

This is the proposition introduced today before the Federated Community clubs meeting at the Klamath Falls chamber of commerce, by H. J. Ticknor of Langell Valley. Ticknor believes that many farmers, after placing money to meet their taxes in the bank, will draw it out when an inviting deal offers. And as the result, when regular bi-annual installments of taxes are due that they have not sufficient funds to meet them. Heavy penalties result.

If the money laid aside for taxes had been placed in the hands of the sheriff it could not be withdrawn whenever a bargain came along. Not only the individual would be the gainer, but as well the county as a whole would be benefited, in the opinion of Ticknor.

Tax delinquencies reach staggering figures now, and Ticknor believes that with minimum payments of ten per cent of the taxes payable whenever the money was in hand, that the delinquencies would be greatly reduced.

"This is an age of part payments," said Ticknor. "The grocer would not refuse a part payment on his bill, yet the county cannot accept \$50, say, on a \$500 tax bill. The farmer must have \$250 ready one time and another \$250 ready the next time. This loses money for the county."

Ticknor has discussed his plan with several authorities. He has discovered no well founded objections.

The matter was considered of such importance that an effort is to be made to get legislative delegates interested. On motion of C. A. Henderson, county agent, the call was sent out for a full representation of all clubs in the district to hear the plan on Saturday, Dec. 19. U. E. Reeder of Henley presided at the meeting yesterday.
