# Rocky Kansas Is New Lightweight World's Champion

BUFFALO, N. Y., Dec. 7.—Rocky Kansas, won the lightweight championship of the world from Jimmy Goodrich in 15 rounds of fighting Monday night. There was no knockout.

Kansas gained an advantage in the early rounds, and although Goodrich fought hard to take the lead toward the end, he was unable even to come abreast of Kansas in the opinion of the officials.

Approximately 12,000 persons saw the fight in the Broadway auditorium, the largest crowd which has turned out for a fight in this town since Young Stribling and Jimmy Slattery met a year ago.

James Crowley, of New York, refereed the bout; Thomas Flynn, of Haverstraw and George Patrick, of New York were judges.

Chairman Farley of the state boxing commission was among the spectators.

The receipts were \$33,900.

# Umatilla Wheat Moves to Market

PENDLETON, Sept. 7.—According to Henry W. Collins, one of the biggest individual grain dealers in the wheat area, about 500,000 bushels of Umatilla county wheat changed hands last week. The movement to market reached its high point Friday when about 250,000 bushels changed hands. Prices ranged up to \$1.50 for the best. At the present about 42 per cent of the Umatilla crop, consisting of around five million bushels remains in the hands of the growers.

Present weather conditions are held to be almost ideal for fall sown grain which suffered something of a setback by reason of the dry early fall. Warm weather and showers almost daily are bringing the wheat up rapidly.
