

# WILD RIDE OVER MOUNTAIN ROAD MAY SAVE LIFE

## Trip to Medford for Serum Brings Hope for Lad in Klamath

Gasoline, fed to capacity into the carburetor of a state automobile, piloted by Joe McMahan, state traffic officer, probably has saved the life of 10-year-old Roy Hawkins, 502 Oak street.

Last night the attending physician announced that the lad, who had been insensible, had regained consciousness after a special serum, to combat spinal meningitis, had been rushed here by automobile.

"Young Hawkins has an excellent chance to recover now," the doctor said last night. "Had the serum not been procured, death would have been almost certain."

Thursday young Hawkins was found to be a victim of the terrible disease which sometimes warps limbs and frequently causes death.

His physician found that the serum so badly needed, was not to be had in Klamath Falls. There was, however, some in Medford.

The doctor appealed to McMahan. A life was at stake.

"I'll go—and I'll go fast," McMahan promised.

And he did. At Ashland Medford officers met Klamath officers, and the liquid was transferred.

Back over the treacherous road sped the McMahan machine. Speed laws were ignored. A lad was about to die.

At 8 o'clock Friday night the car returned to Klamath Falls. Promptly the serum was administered.

Last night the youth was in much better condition and medics, as well as relatives, were optimistic.

And if the life of Roy Hawkins is saved, it will be through the use of gasoline—gasoline which made possible the securing of a serum.

No new cases of the disease had been reported to the county health unit yesterday evening, according to Dr. G. S. Newsom, in charge.

The use of some antiseptic, to spray the throats of possible victims, was suggested by Dr. Newsom.

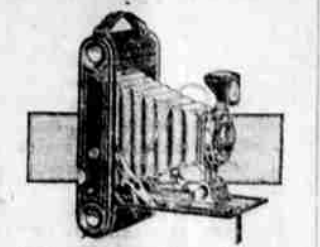
