## SERVICE BUILDS ROADS, TRAILS

Forestry Dept. Shows New Construction Through Klamath's Mts

During the 1925 session, the forest service was exceptionally successful in its construction work in and near the Crater national forest, according to Forest Supervisor Rankin.

Work on four mountain roads are practically completed, while approximately 64 miles of trail were finished. In speaking of the road and trail work, Supervisor Rankin remarked that although the roads were primarily built for forest protection and for opening interior forest regions, they are also of value to the hunter, the camper and settler.

Six miles of road between Applegate river and Steamboat ranch were built and a new road around the foot of Manzanita hill in the Applegate district eliminated a steep and narrow grade.

**\$5,000 Spent**  
A total of \$5,000 was expended on the Dead Indian Soda Springs road, and, according to present plans, a like amount will be spent next year to transform it into a first class mountain road.

A road from Fish lake ending in the vicinity of Four Blt creek was also completed.

A trail, seven miles long, from Lamb's mine to McDonald Gap, around the south end of Ashland mountain, was made and 26 miles on the tributaries of the North Fork of Rogue river were completed. Eight and one-fourth miles of new trail on the south and middle forks of the same river furnishes a much

Notice is hereby given that a bond election is called to be held at various school houses in Klamath County School District on the 23d day of December, 1925, between the hours of two o'clock p. m. and seven o'clock p. m., for the purpose of voting upon the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness of \$75,000 for the purpose of building school houses, additional school rooms, purchase of equipment, all as set forth in notices posted on each school house door.

Polls will open at two o'clock and close at seven o'clock p. m. A legal voter is one who is a citizen, has resided for a time of 30 days in the district, and has property listed upon the last assessment roll of the county school district. Heads of families having children of school age may vote without property qualification.

This bond issue of \$75,000 will be carried by entire valuation of county school district which approximates \$20,000,000.

A voter of the county school district may cast his ballot at any of the polling places in the district, and not necessarily in his own sub-district.

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 16.—Research work is being started this month that will lead eventually to
