

SETTLEMENT OF COAL STRIKE IS NOW INDEFINITE

Cole and Ted Jackson Must Face a Jury In the Circuit Court

Scranton, Pa., Dec. 21. (United News)—Prospects for immediate settlement of the battle between anthracite coal operators and the United Mine Workers of America seemed more remote Monday night, after the mine owners had refused to resume negotiations with the miners here Tuesday.

A few hours previously a way to probable settlement had appeared to be open. John L. Lewis, president of the mine workers had tentatively accepted the invitation of a committee of mayors and burgesses in the anthracite region to a joint conference with the operators. When Lewis announced that he was willing to discuss only the plan of settlement proposed by Governor Gifford Pinchot, the operators refused to enter the conference.

It now appears that no further attempt will be made to bring the warring factions together until after the Christmas holidays.

Moore Given 30 Days and \$300

Found guilty on a charge of shooting elk, Leonard Moore yesterday was sentenced by Circuit Judge A. L. Leavitt to serve 30 days in the county jail and to pay a fine of \$300.

Counsel for Moore announced that the case will be appealed to the state supreme court.

CHICAGO, Dec. 21. (United News)—A white setting was prepared for Christmas in the middle west as a near blizzard ushered in the first official day of winter and blanketed wide areas with snow, three to eight inches deep.

JAP WORKERS IN SERIOUS FIGHT

TOKYO, Dec. 22. (Tuesday)—More than 100 workmen are reported to have been killed or wounded at Tsurumi, in a fight which began Monday night and continued until this morning.

About 1,500 employees of rival contracting companies were in the fight, armed with rifles, revolvers and swords.

Hundreds of police and gendarm-

es surrounded the fighters, preventing the reinforcements, which were rushed from the various camps, from joining the melee. Scores of battlers were arrested. Tsurumi is midway between Tokyo and Yokohama.


