**Olene Rancher In**—D. Ellis Young, well known rancher of the Olene country, spent yesterday in the city on business and enjoying a holiday shopping tour.

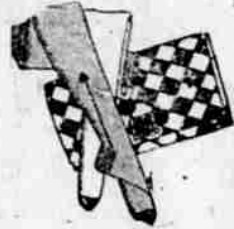
