

FIERY EDITOR IS FREED OF CHARGE

ALBUQUERQUE (N. M.), Dec. 22.—(United News)—The long drawn out contempt case against Carl Magee, fiery editor of the State Tribune, came to an end Monday when the state supreme court upheld the validity of the pardon issued to him in 1924 by the governor of the state.

Magee was convicted on three charges of contempt of court by Judge D. J. Leahy of Las Vegas, following a long, bitter political struggle in which the editor led the attack against the judge in his campaign for re-election. The contempt case grew out of editorials written by Magee as well as speeches delivered in Leahy's courtroom.

The sentence on the three charges was ninety days in jail. Governor Hinkle immediately pardoned the editor, but the pardon was ignored by the sheriff of San Miguel county, who contended that the governor had no authority in the case. Magee lay in jail three days before finally getting the case into the state supreme court on habeas corpus proceedings. He has been under bond since.

\$75,000 Cleaned in Jewel Robbery

NEW YORK, Dec. 22.—While New York's entire police force, stirred to action by charges brought by Mayor-elect "Jimmy" Walker, was knocking at the front doors of speakeasies and gambling halls and rounding up several hundred petty offenders over the week-end, some more ambitious criminals slipped in at the back door of a fashionable west side apartment and perpetrated one of the largest jewel thefts of the season.

Diamonds, emeralds and pearls belonging to Mrs. William T. Starr, valued by her at \$75,000, although her husband, a member of the New York stock exchange, says the actual value was about \$20,000, disappeared mysteriously during the family's absence Sunday afternoon. By Monday night the police and detectives who had been assigned to the case had made no headway, other than to point out the similarity between this robbery and the theft of the Donahue pearls from the Hotel Plaza last September.

When the jewels of Mrs. Donahue, heiress to the Woolworth millions, vanished from the Plaza the case was put in the hands of Noel C. Scaffa, a private detective, who is connected with several insurance firms. Scaffa succeeded in getting back the Donahue pearls, valued at \$650,000, by obtaining a reward of \$65,000 from the insurance companies, and paying the money, according to his story to a "go-between."

CONTROL THEATER.
