English Gossips Marry Off Prince

LONDON, Jan. 20. — (United
 News)—British gossip is rising to
 a crescendo of certainty regarding
 the engagement of the Prince of
 Wales to Princess Astrid of Swe-
 den as the failure of the court to
 squelch the rumors by the only
 means in its power becomes increas-
 ingly obvious.

Wales himself is reported to be
 somewhat disturbed by the public
 speculation. But unless the British
 or Swedish courts officially an-
 nounce that the reports that Astrid
 will visit at Buckingham palace dur-
 ing the approaching season are un-
 true, the discussion will continue
 despite any royal annoyance. So far
 no denial has been forthcoming
 and the public accepts the court
 silence as tacit admission that there
 is something to talk about.

U. S. C. COACH SAYS HE WILL NOT HELP PORTLAND PLAYERS

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 20. — (United
 News)—Bill Spaulding, football
 coach at the University of California,
 southern branch, vigorously de-
 nied that he would coach the Port-
 land Waterfront Athletic club team,
 which is to play "Red" Grange and
 his Bears in Portland, January 30.

Reports from the northern city
 stated that the Grizzly strategists
 would arrive there in a few days.

"This is the first I have heard of
 it, and it is a falsehood. I have not
 received any offers to coach a pro-
 fessional team and I would not con-
 sider any," Spaulding said.

Southern branch officials indicated
 that the attitude of the university
 was strictly opposed to professional
 football.

 when a one-story brick wall col-
 lapsed shortly before noon today.
 They were tearing down an old
 building. The workmen were bur-
 ied under a mass of brick and mor-
