RESOLUTION

The City Engineer, pursuant to resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having on the 21st day of December, 1925, filed plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of improving Main Street from Spring Street easterly to the city limits of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, including intersections, and the Council having taken same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates to be satisfactory;

BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of said street be and the same are hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of said streets in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates. Said improvements to consist of paving said streets with concrete pavement. Warrenite bitulthic pavement with bitulthic concrete base, Warrenite bitulthic pavement with rock base or water bound Macadam pavement, at an estimated cost, including cement sidewalks, curbing, gutters, drains and sewerage for concrete or Warrenite bitulthic pavement with bituminous concrete base of \$39,313.54, for Warrenite bitulthic pavement with rock base, \$34,591.61, and for water bound Macadam pavement with rock Macadam base, \$23,380.96. Said improvement in either case to include grading, rolling, sewerage, drainage and curbing; said paving to be 56 feet wide from Spring Street easterly to the Southern Pacific Co. right of way, inclusive, and 41 feet wide from the east line of the Southern Pacific Co. right of way to Michigan Avenue, inclusive, and 30 feet wide from the east line of Michigan Avenue easterly to the city limits, with concrete sidewalks 5 feet wide on both sides thereof throughout the entire length of said improvement, with parking strips leveled throughout on both sides.

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
