

NEW STORM HITS MID-WEST AREA

Traffic Held Up and Train Schedules Demoralized In Kas.

CHICAGO, Feb. 18. — (United News) — Blinding snowstorms are lashing the middle west with much colder weather and additional suffering in prospect for Friday.

Spreading eastward from the Rocky mountains the blizzards have now engulfed Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska, Iowa, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota, the Dakotas and parts of Indiana, Ohio and Michigan.

Deep snowdrifts have thrown trains off their schedules, west of Kansas City. Highways became impassable as the flakes drifted high against fences and signboards.

Chicago, Kansas City, Omaha and other mid-continent cities stopped through wet and mushy drifts. Walking and driving were hazardous.

In Kansas and Missouri the blizzard was terrific. Dozens of store windows gave way to the force of a 56-mile gale. Trains crept at a snail's pace through drifts that were packed in cuts on the western prairies and limped into terminal stations hours behind schedules.

Dodge City, Kas., was snowbound, delegates to a district church convention being unable to plow through the drifts to their meeting place.

The weather bureau here said the disturbances originated in the Alaskan gulf, sweeping inland over the Oregon coast, thence down into the Texas Panhandle, where they curved northward.

SIGNAL BRINGS AID TO TRAPPER

Man Shot Thru Foot Flies White Shirt on Top Of His Cabin

WINEMUCCA, Nev., Feb. 18. — (United News) — A white shirt, fluttering from the top of a trapper's cabin in a lonely spot on Kelly creek, brought the help that probably saved the life of Alexander Eyraud.

The woodsman accidentally shot himself through the foot a week ago, in great pain, but with no way to obtain medical assistance. Eyraud hoisted his flag of distress and waited, his suffering increasing with every hour.

Four days later K. G. Lamb, a gentleman, saw the signal and investigated. He brought Eyraud to Winnemucca, where an amputation operation was performed successfully Thursday.

Back Tax List Is Lowest of Record

Sheriff Bart E. Hawkins is circulating four volumes of tragic circumstances—the 1924 list of delinquencies in the matter of taxes.

They are volumes comprising 100 pages, none of which is any more interesting than the other. The most interesting pages, of course, are those on which one's own name may appear.

They may be seen at Bonanza, Merrill, Chillicothe and Klamath Falls post offices. It is required that they be posted by law.

According to Sheriff and Tax Collector Hawkins the total delinquencies for 1924 amounted to \$86,500. But this amount is the smallest the delinquencies have ever been in recent years. The total includes about \$10,000 which the irrigation districts have assessed against government owned lands, a practice that has been discontinued.

Helen to Get a Revenge Match

CANNES, Feb. 18. — (United News) — Helen Wills, American tennis champion, is to have her "revenge" match with Suzanne Lenglen on March 8.

The California girl has announced that she will enter the singles tournament which starts at Nice the week after next.

"I have decided to play, and I hope Miss Lenglen does, too," said Miss Wills. "The arrangement should please her, for she has played on the courts at Nice since she was a child."

Pere Lenglen, father of the French champion, already had announced that Suzanne would play at Nice, even if she did not enter any other singles matches until the tennis championships at Wimbledon next spring.

TURKS PUT BAN UPON POLYGAMY

Modernization of Country Takes Big Stride Forward

CONSTANTINOPLE, Feb. 18. — (United News) — Polygamy has been abolished in Turkey by the national assembly. The assembly restricted the hitherto unlimited rights of divorce in the same bill which abolished polygamy. The vote was unanimous.

Abolition of polygamy, a traditional custom in Turkey throughout the ages, probably is the most drastic step taken so far in the modernization campaign of Mustafa Kemal. Its effect, however, will not be so severe as it would have been a decade ago, for in recent years economic conditions have enforced monogamy on all but the wealthiest Turks. The high cost of living made maintenance of more than one wife prohibitive for the average man.

Under Mohammedan law, a true believer was entitled to four wives. With that to go on many Turks felt privileged to have as many as they wanted.
