

AMERICAN NAT'L TO BE REVAMPED

Progressive Klamath Depository to Install New Set of Fixtures

Indicative of the rapid strides made by the American National Bank during the past few years is the announcement yesterday of plans to remodel the interior of the building at a cost in excess of \$15,000, according to E. M. Bubb, cashier.

The bank will be remodeled entirely with the bank room and upper floor torn out. Construction will start immediately to be completed by April 1.

Radical changes in the interior of the building will serve the public to better advantage as the lobby will be practically twice as large. The back stairway used as an access to the upper rooms in the bank, will be torn out as will the present vault. The use of the stairway in the Peltz building has been contracted for.

Included in the new bank fixtures will be two large safety vaults, one for the bank and one for the safety deposit department. Purchase of an up-to-date vault door has been made.

All of the old fixtures will be completely torn out and a contract has been let with the P. T. Ainge company of Portland to install complete sets of new banking fixtures. An architect has been in the city for the past two weeks conferring with bank officials in regard to the renovation of the building.

"We have been crowded for space for some time and have been unable to take care of the customers in the manner we would like," said Mr. Bubb yesterday.

"A complete set of new banking fixtures will enable us to employ more help during the coming years."

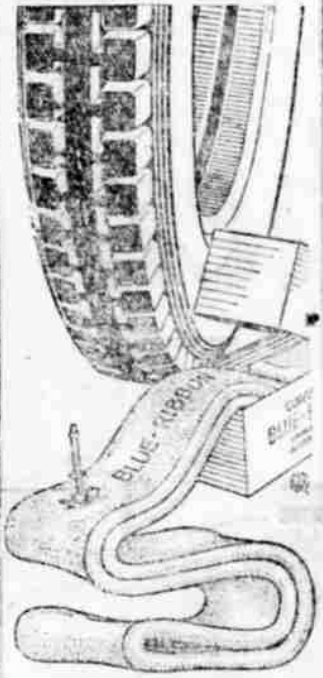
