An architect has been in the city for the past two weeks conferring with bank officials in regard to the renovation of the building.

"We have been crowded for space for some time and have been unable to take care of the customers in the anner we would like," said Mr. Bubb yesterday.

"A complete set of new banking fixtures will enable us to employ more help during the coming years.


