The game was advocated to provide intercollegiate competition now lacking owing to the great distance to the nearest Canadian colleges, the closest being in Alberta.

The American schools in the Puget Sound district, however, are only a day's run by train or boat.

U. B. C. will enjoy the distinction of being the only British university playing the American game of football.
