

## NEW ICE PLANT OPEN TO PUBLIC

Andy Collier to Be Host to  
Visitors; Soft Drinks  
To Be Served

The public will have a chance to see how ice is made in a brand new ice plant Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons any time after 1:30 o'clock.

Andy M. Collier, president and general manager of the Klamath Ice and Storage company, is inviting the world to come in and look over the plant. There will be plenty of soft drinks for all hands.

Collier has something for the public to see in his new plant, of which he is president and general manager. Fred E. Fleet is vice president. Both are proud of what they have—the most up-to-date ice making equipment in Oregon, all of which has just been installed. The

ice making capacity has been increased from 10 to 20 tons a day, and the plant itself is the last thing in cleanliness and sanitation.

Water used in making ice at the Klamath Falls plant passes through charcoal and quartz filters. It has, of course, been tested by chemists under the direction of Dr. Ed Johnson before it reaches the plant. But Dr. Johnson is called in at regular intervals to make tests at the plant.

The new machinery does away

with the system of filling the big 400-pound tanks by a hose. Here is the way it is done now: An electric crane hooks onto two cans full of ice, pulls them out of the brine tank and they are pushed over to a chute and dumped, going either into a small day storage room or into a big winter storage of 400 tons capacity.

Then they go under two spouts, a lever is pulled and they are filled with 400 pounds of water. Back they go and are lowered into place to be frozen again. The operation is as simple as it is possible for mechanics to make it.

The product itself is the last word in purity. There is not even a center core left in the blocks of ice, air keeping the water agitated until it freezes solid and blowing out the bubbles that formerly accumulated at the center.

Go down and look the plant over on the invitation of President Collier. You will enjoy the tinkle of a piece of ice in the glass all the more for knowing how it is made.

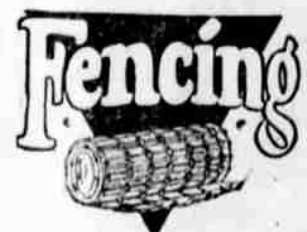
