MEXICAN CHURCH FIGHT IS FATAL

TEPIC, Nayarit, Mex., March 12.—(United News)—The mayor of Jalisco, Mexico, and two representatives of the state of Nayarit were killed by an infuriated mob of men, women and children at Jalisco recently when they attempted to close a Catholic church in which services were being held in defiance of the closing law of the government.

According to information received here Friday, the priest of the church, whose name has not been obtained, ordered his congregation to stand its ground and defied the officials when they appeared to read orders demanding the closing of the church.

As he argued with the officials the congregation grew into an angry and threatening mob. The mayor, whose name was not given, appeared. It is reported that at first he sided with the priest and his congregation but gave way when the officials reminded him of his duty to his government.

It is believed that the mob attacked the three men at this point. All three were so badly mutilated with sticks, stones and fists that they died. The representatives killed are Congressman Porras and Senor Ortega.

Several men and women are injured, one girl so seriously that it is reported she will die.
