

FRANKLIN CAR IS READY FOR ROAD

WASHINGTON, March 27.—America's delegation to the Geneva arms preparatory commission, was named today by President Coolidge and Hugh Gibson, ambassador to Switzerland, will be in charge of the trip.

Besides Gibson, members of the party will be: Allan W. Dulles and Dorsey Richardson, representing the state department; Major General Dennis R. Nolan, brig. Gen. H. H. Smith and Major G. H. Strong, representing the war department; Rear Admiral Hilary P. Jones, Rear Admiral Andrew Long and Captain Adolphus Andrews, representing the navy department.

Allan F. Wislawa, secretary of the American location at Bern, will act as secretary of the delegation.

President at Last Wins Appointment

WASHINGTON, March 27.—President Coolidge won his first important victory over the senate this morning with confirmation Friday of Thomas F. Woodlock as a member of the interstate commerce commission. Woodlock's name had been sent up three different times and pocketed twice.

The successful outcome of the administering Woodlock fight which has lasted for a year, was won by a vote of 52 to 25.

The president's victory was laid to his maneuver in promising Pennsylvania, the south and southwest representation on the railroad regulating body if the proposed bill for reorganizing the commission along geographical lines is enacted. Several votes were changed by this pledge.

KILLER PUTTING UP BATTLE FOR LIFE

NEW YORK, March 27.—(United Press)—Eleven days from the noose, Gerald Chapman through his attorneys is battling desperately for life.

Counsel for the bandit who is sentenced to hang on April 6 for the murder of a New Britain, Conn., policeman, will invoke an old common law writ known as "Coram Nobis." will seek a writ of habeas corpus in the United States district court and will make a motion for a new trial in the state courts on grounds of newly discovered evidence, the lawyers announced Friday.

In the upper body Senator Borah, republican, Idaho, warned that unless some definite action was taken before fall the result would be disastrous. It is a non-party question Borah declared.

Representative Tanager, republican, Kansas, was the compelling force for the lower house in the agriculture committee's meeting. His warning was that the relief program of the corn belt committee proposed by the Des Moines group, if enacted would virtually ruin the stock raiser in order to give help to the corn grower.

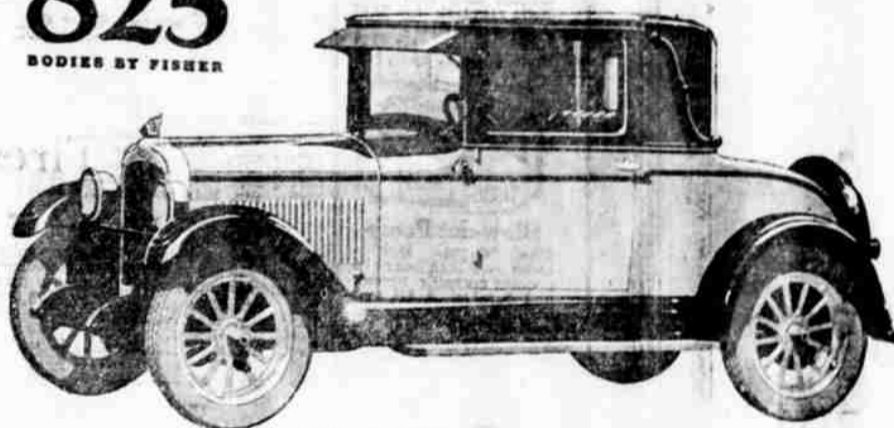
