RESOLUTION OF INTENTION LINCOLN STREET PAVEMENT

The City Engineer, pursuant to resolution of the Common Council, heretofore adopted, having on the 12th day of April, 1926, filed plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of improving Lincoln street from Third street to Fifth street, to be known as Improvement Unit Number 47, and the Council having taken same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of the said portion of said street, being the specification and estimates attached to the plans and estimates filed herein on April 12, 1926, be and the same are hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portion of said street in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates. Said improvement to consist of paving said portion of said street with

(a) Type "C" Portland cement concrete or Vibrolithic or Warrentite Bitulithic, with 1 1/2" top, 3/4" bituminous concrete base, or asphaltic concrete 1 1/2" top, 1" binder, 3/4" asphaltic concrete base; or

(b) Type "A" Portland cement concrete or Vibrolithic or Warrentite Bitulithic, 2" top, 4" bituminous concrete base, or asphaltic concrete, 2" top, 1" binder, 4" base; or

(c) Warrentite Bitulithic or Asphaltic concrete, 2" top, 4" crushed rock base; at an estimated cost, including cement sidewalks, curbing, gutters and drainage, for (a) Type "C" Portland cement concrete or Vibrolithic or Warrentite Bitulithic, with 1 1/2" top, 3/4" bituminous concrete base, or Asphaltic concrete 1 1/2" top, 1" binder, 3/4" asphaltic concrete base, of \$18,000.10; for (b) Type "A" Portland cement concrete or Vibrolithic or Warrentite Bitulithic, 2" top, 4" bituminous concrete base, or Asphaltic concrete 2" top, 1" binder, 4" base, of \$18,000.10; and for (c) Warrentite Bitulithic or Asphaltic concrete, 2" top, 4" crushed rock base, of \$17,625.90; said estimates in either event to include engineering, supervision, advertising, clerical assistance and unforeseen contingencies; also, concrete sidewalks five (5) feet wide on both sides of said improvement throughout the entire length, with parking strips levelled and rolled throughout, on both sides, except at intersections, where said pavement is to be full width; said pavement to be Twenty-eight (28) feet wide; all in accordance with the said plans, specifications and estimates, and with the plans and estimates filed March 29, 1926.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL that the property heretofore described be and hereby is declared to be benefited, to-wit:

Lots 1 to 5, inc., Block 42; Lots 6 to 10, inc., Block 36; Lots 6 to 10, inc., Block 37; Lots 1 to 5, inc., Block 41; all in First Addition to Klamath Falls, Oregon; and that said property above described be and hereby is declared to be benefited in accordance with the expense of said improvement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Monday, the 24th day of May, 1926, at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m., at the Council Chambers in the City Hall of Klamath Falls, Oregon, be fixed as the time and place for the hearing of objections and remonstrances against said proposed improvement; and

The Police Judge be and he hereby is directed to cause notice of said hearing to be published as by charter provided.

NOTICE INVITING BIDS FOR STREET IMPROVEMENT

Unit No. 43 Pursuant to Ordinance No. 757 of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, notice is hereby given that bids will be received by the Police Judge of said city, at his office in the City Hall, up to and including Mon-

day, the 17th day of May, 1926, at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m., for making the proposed improvement of Main street from Spring street easterly to the City Limits, including intersection.

The proposed improvement to be made includes the grading, rolling, sewerage, drainage and curbing; said pavement to be 50 feet wide from Spring street easterly to the Southern Pacific Company right of way, inclusive, and 41 feet wide from the east side of the Southern Pacific Company's right of way easterly to Michigan avenue, inclusive, and 39 feet wide from the easterly line of Michigan avenue to the city limits, with concrete sidewalks 5 feet wide on both sides thereof throughout the entire length of said improvement, with parking strips levelled on both sides, the same to be in all respects according to the plans of the City Engineer on file in the office of the Police Judge.
