lumber with which to erect a special exhibit and a cottage. The chamber of commerce is pledged to maintain the exhibit.

Entirely Pine
The buildings themselves will be no small part of the exhibit. These are the only buildings known to be constructed entirely of Klamath county pine. The lumbermen are taking particular pains to display the effective finish possible with pine, both inside and out. The buildings are now nearing completion, the work having been done by Klamath Falls carpenters.

There was already a commodious tavern type building on the property. This will be used as a lunch room and supply depot for the traveling public. There will be maintained, of course, a gasoline and oil service station.

The camp ground is to be fully equipped and put in operation. Plans are being developed to build camp cottages.

The contract under which Stevenson will take charge assures the stockholders a full return on their investment. They are, however, chiefly interested in the publicity Klamath county will receive from the enterprise.

Stevenson resigned as a director in the tourist bureau corporation, and M. P. Evans was named in his stead. At the same time Stevenson is resigning his place as manager of The Klamath News.

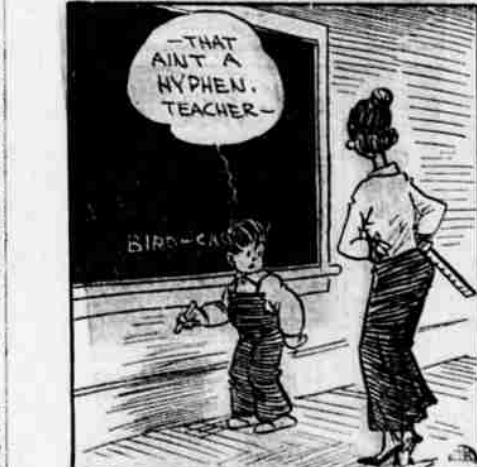
