

BOBBY JONES GREAT GOLFER, WINS LAURELS

SCIOTO COUNTRY CLUB, Columbus, O., July 10.—Bobby Jones, the amateur and British open golf champion, bid for America's premier golfing honors and won—not only the 1926 championship but the acclaiming cheers of the multitude.

The Atlanta youngster had demonstrated without fear of contradiction that he is the greatest son of fairways for all time.

It was from a preordained triumph, for the Atlantan was tagging the leaders, Wild Bill Mehlhorn and Joe Turnesa almost from the start.

It was by a margin of one stroke that the cool but determined Bobby swept home to victory, ahead of Turnesa, the young and brilliant Italo-American, who cracked under the fierce strain and finished with a 298.

Turnesa would have won, but like other embryonic champions of the past, failed in the crisis. Pushing steadily along behind Jones and Turnesa came Wild Bill Mehlhorn, the Texan of the Old Colony club, Chicago.

Mehlhorn started the play Thursday for a sensational 68 for the first 18. He performed almost as well yesterday, but today the crack, which many golfing experts believed inevitable, came, and Mehlhorn was relegated to the ranks of the defeated.

Bobby Jones was an uphill almost from the beginning. But his was an unconquerable spirit. Twice during the day his flying sphere hit onlookers. Other incidents, equally trying, first a blistering sun, next blustering winds and torrential rains, contributed to his uphill battle.

On one occasion Bobby penalized himself when the wind moved his ball.

But it took more than hard luck to down America's greatest golfer. His recoveries were remarkable and time and again he shot birdies and once an eagle to lay dead to the pin.

The title won by Jones today was relinquished by Willie Macfarlane.

Among the runners up, besides Turnesa and Mehlhorn were Walter Haggen, Gene Sarazen and Johnny Farrell, with 297 and Willie Hunter with 300.

Until Bobby's sensational play this afternoon these golfers' names had been lined with the championship.

After Bobby entered the locker room Joe Turnesa was one of the first to step forward and shake his hand.

"Good work, Bobby," the New Yorker said.

"Thanks," Bobby replied sorry you couldn't have been there too.

"Well, you're a better golfer than I am," Joe stammered.
