

### Walter Hagen Is Winner Eastern Golfing Contest

DELAWARE WATER GAP, Pa., July 20.—(United News)—Walter Hagen easily won the eastern open golf championship over the Wolf Hollow course Tuesday, but failed by one stroke to equal the world's record of 72 holes of medal competition.

After the Pasadena pro reeled off 67-65-132 on Monday he left the field hopelessly far behind. Among the leaders, Johnny Farrell was the only one to keep pace with Hagen, who finished up 74-69-143 for a total of 275 for his four rounds. Farrell, who was nine strokes behind Walter Monday, was second with 284 and Bill Mehlhorn was third with 289.

In the Ohio state open at Youngstown a number of years ago Emmet French established a low medal play record of 274.

### Isolation Hospital Is Assured County

merce have been advocating the immediate construction of an isolation hospital.

Has Long Been Needed. During the spinal meningitis epidemic, which was fatal to nearly 50 persons in Klamath county, there was little or no facility for the care of those stricken with the fatal malady. The isolation hospital then in use, had been condemned by the county health authorities and physicians refused to send their patients to the place for fear of contracting other diseases.

During the past two weeks another matter has presented itself to the sheriff and the district attorney, through the incarceration and association of Ray Wetzel with other prisoners, said to have a dread communicable disease.

Legal Status Conflicting. The matter was taken up with the county court, but no legal way could be found out of the affair. It is unlawful to put a man in solitary confinement. The district attorney's office wired the attorney general and the governor, and return wires stated that there was no way out of the predicament unless there were other quarters of the jail or space in an isolation hospital in which to provide for the afflicted prisoner.

The case of Wetzel has hastened the isolation hospital affair materially and immediate construction of the building will start after the purchase of the site. County and city funds will be joined in the construction of the hospital.

Dr. Norris, who is a fundamentalist clergyman of well-defined ideas, has long been a storm center in his home city. He habitually assailed public officials, charging laxity in enforcing criminal laws, and hinted at their alliance with lawbreakers. His plight apparently has not changed his standing among members of his congregation, who, walking quietly into the corridors of the court building, refer to him as "Pastor Norris."

A swimmer got into trouble in heavy surf about 150 feet from shore and called for help. Edward Nugent, a lifeguard, swam to the man and brought him to the beach without difficulty. As he reached the shore Thaw helped him carry the man to a barrel and roll out an excess of sea water.

Harry's friends slapped his back and told him he was a hero and the crowd took it up. Thaw smiled broadly. So did the lifeguard.

### Rickard Offering New York Chance For Dempsey Bout

NEW YORK, July 20.—(United News)—Tex Rickard gave the New York state boxing commission a chance Tuesday to get the proposed Dempsey-Tunney fight, but the commission remained obdurate and the opportunity passed.

In the midst of his dickering with Chicago financiers who wanted to have the heavy weight match in the windy city, Tex put out a "feeler" through his friend on the commission, William E. Muldoon, who proposed that the subject of permitting a Dempsey-Tunney bout in New York be reopened. Commissioner Brower, who holds the balance of power, moved that the proposal be tabled. It was Chairman James A. Farley remains adamant in his opposition to permitting the champion to fight anyone before going through with an agreement to fight Harry Wills. As long as Brower stands by Farley, the commission can prevent Rickard from giving Gene Tunney a chance at the title in this state.

Jack Delaney's first appearance since he won the light heavyweight title from Paul Berlenbach last Friday probably will be against Jack Sharkey, the Boston heavyweight. The promoters of Coney Island stadium were authorized by the boxing board to stage this fight in September.

August 11 was set as the date for the bout between Paul Berlenbach and Francis Charles, light heavyweight champion of Europe, while a week later, Berlenbach will meet McTigue and Tommy Loughran will fight another light heavyweight contender. Young Stribling refused Jack Fugazy's offer of a fight with Loughran "Pa" Stribling claiming his boy was not in condition to take on the Philadelphia.

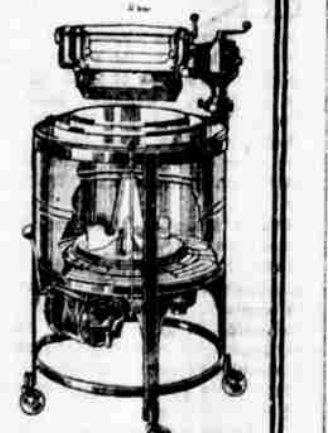
