Ma Ferguson Has Test Politically Confronting Her

DALLAS, Tex., July 21.—(United News)—All the political upheavals and scandals since Texas placed its government in the hands of a woman, have been revived in the state primary campaign.

Governor Miriam A. Ferguson is standing staunchly on her record, but "Farmer Jim," her husband, is doing the leg work, and both are confident they will occupy the gubernatorial mansion for another term.

"Ma" must lift her petticoats over the bar of three hurdles before she can be certain of maintaining for another two years the high position that she now holds. She must be one of the two leaders in the democratic primary election next Saturday. She must win the "run-off" primary on August 21, and she must defeat her republican opponent in the regular election in November.

The first two hurdles are the hardest as the Ferguson are not as popular in Texas democracy as they once were, but as for the third barrier, democratic nomination is still considered tantamount to election and the governor will have an easy fight no matter who is named by the republicans to oppose her.

Mrs. Ferguson has two major democratic opponents for the nomination, Attorney Charles Dan Moody who dug up the charges against her administration of the highway department, and Lynch Davidson of Houston, who is against "Fergusonism," which he describes as the political alliance between "Ma" and "Father Jim."

Two other women and a minister are also in the race, but they are basing their bids on educational reforms, which have never been very popular in Texas. The women are Mrs. Edith Wilman of Dallas and Mrs. Kate Johnson of San Antonio, and the minister is Rev. O. F. Zimmerman.

The personal has done a minimum of personal campaigning, leaving most of that work to her husband, who is more experienced. The day before the first primary, however, she will deliver a campaign speech in Houston.

In the republican contest for the gubernatorial nomination, E. P. Scott of Corpus Christi is opposed by H. F. Haines of Houston. The republican split is over congressional patronage and is largely a matter of local interest in the district of Congressman Harry Weisbach.

White Star Fleet Negotiations Are Reported Failure LONDON, July 21.—(United Press)—Negotiations for the sale of the White Star fleet, operating the Homeric, Majestic and other well known trans-Atlantic liners to a syndicate headed by Furness Withy and company, have failed. It was learned at the White Star office today.

The International Mercantile Marine company owns the White Star line. It believes that certain British shipping interests opposed the deal and that the Americans were also disinclined to sell in view of the effects of the coal strike. The announcement said the negotiations had been terminated by "mutual assent."
