Formation of the first woman's club of America composed entirely of Indian women, the Eagle Feathers club, was a feature of the second national Indian congress this week.

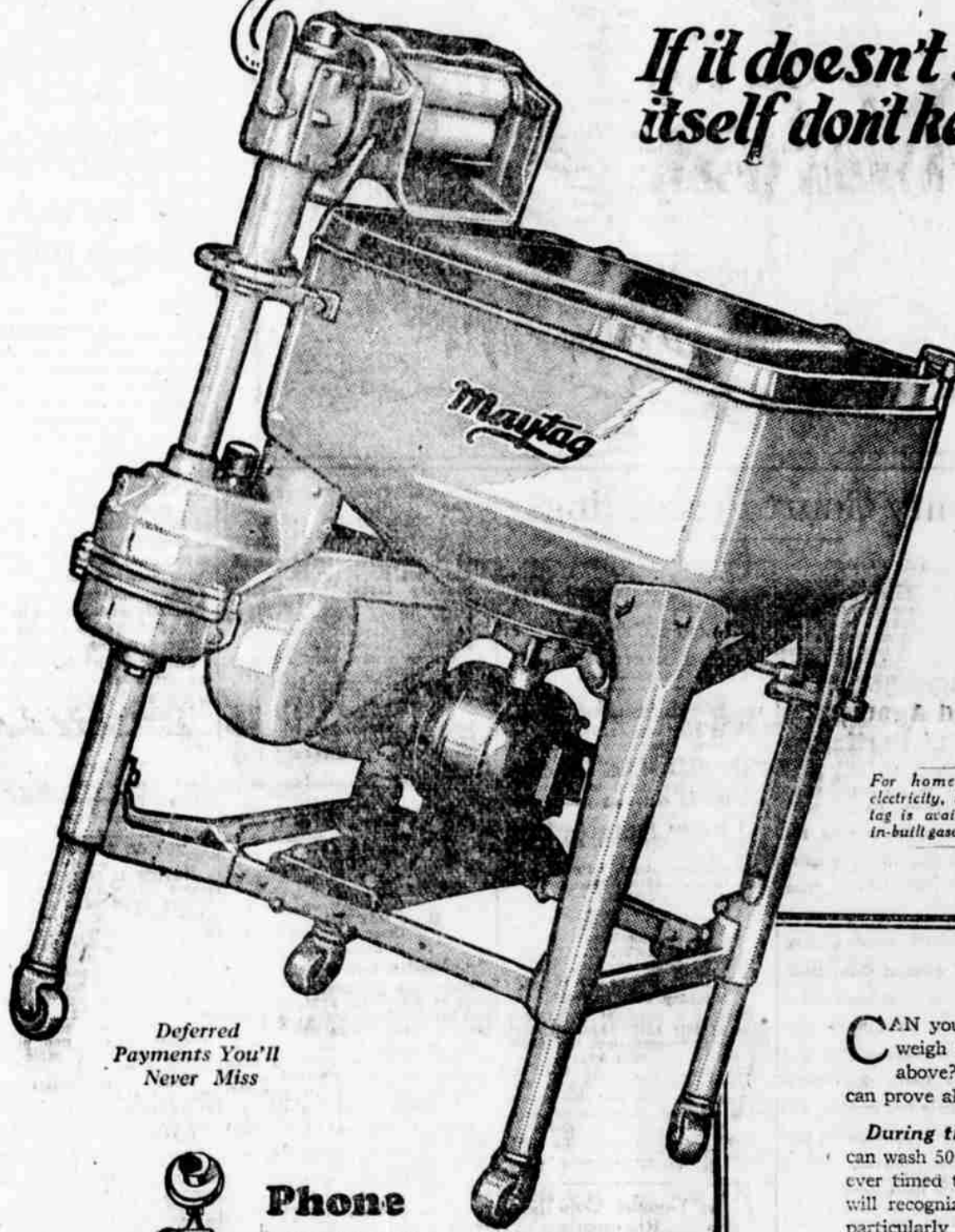
### COLLIE DISLIKES FLORIDA; WALKED BACK HOME
