RESOLUTION OF INTENTION
COMMERCIAL STREET AND WALNUT AVENUE PAVEMENT.
 The City Engineer, pursuant to resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having on the 19th day of July, 1926, filed plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of improving Commercial street from the north line of Oak avenue to the south line of Klamath avenue, and Walnut avenue from the easterly line of 11th street to the west line of Commercial street, to be known as Improvement Unit Number 64, and the Council having taken same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory,
BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of the said portions of said streets, being the specifications and estimates attached to the plans and estimates filed herein on July 19th, 1926, be and the same are hereby approved; and
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of said streets in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates. Said improvement to consist of paving said portions of said streets with (a) Warrentite bitulithic pavement, 1 1/2" top on 3/4" bituminous concrete base, or type "A" Portland cement concrete, or type "C" vibrolithic pavement, or (b) Warrentite bitulithic pavement, 2" top on 4" crushed rock base, at an estimated cost, including cement sidewalks, curbing, gutters and drainage, for (a) Warrentite bitulithic pavement, 1 1/2" top on 3/4" bituminous concrete base, or type "C" Portland cement concrete, or type "C" vibrolithic pavement, of \$15,928.04; and for (b) Warrentite bitulithic pavement, 2" top on 4" crushed rock base, of \$15,218.72; said estimates to include engineering, supervision and advertising, clerical assistance and unforeseen contingencies; said improvement to consist of grading the said street full width, constructing combination curbs and gutters, building five-foot cement sidewalks on either side of said improvement throughout its entire length, and laying branches for sanitary sewers and providing for storm sewerage, parking strips to be leveled and rolled throughout except at intersections, where said pavement is to be full width.
