Bread and water consumption at the local jail will increase considerably today as the result of a raid on canned heat addicts, staged in the old court house yesterday afternoon, when two local policemen rounded up five imbibers.

All of the men jailed are old offenders, police stated, and several have no doubt become well accustomed to the restricted diet by this time. As the cops pointed out, one advantage of the bread and water stipulation lies in the fact that the men can have all they want of it—but at that they seldom want over half a loaf.

Traffic Officer Morgan issued the telltale slips to eight more violators of the two-hour parking ordinance yesterday. The offenders were all

caught on Main street and are principally city residents who should know the law by this time, the officer said.
