Golf Course Has Been Deeded to Reames Golf Club

Over a year ago, E. R. Reames, pioneer resident and heavy land owner in Klamath county, gave 196 acres of land to be used as a golf course to a country club with the understanding that improvements of \$12,000 be put upon the valuable land before a clear title would be granted.

J. A. Maguire, yesterday afternoon, filed a deed from E. R. Reames and wife, Jennie, to the Reames Golf and Country Club, granting the club the 196 acres on the banks of the lower Klamath Lake.

"We received the land with the understanding that \$12,000 worth of improvements should be put on the acreage before we were granted a clear title. Now we feel that the land has been sufficiently improved. Improvements amounting to more than \$15,000 have been put into the land. Klamath Falls will soon have one of the best golf courses in southern Oregon," stated Maguire.

MEXICAN SITUATION REMAINS UNCHANGED

Official branches of the government appear to be as firmly determined as the executive, to enforce the religious laws.

The conference today apparently was the direct result of President Calles' letter to the bishops in which he repudiated their plea that the religious laws be suspended. He said he would not suspend the laws, but pointed out that the church had recourse to the congress or the courts and suggested that efforts for repeal or suspension be directed toward one or the other of these branches of the government.

In a circular issued today, the episcopate charged that the government had permitted grave indignities to be inflicted upon women recently arrested in connection with conspiracies against the Calles regime. It was alleged that the women were placed in a prison in which were confined immoral women prisoners and that soldiers occupied the women's cells at night.

The circular said the women had not engaged in seditious enterprises and that they did not possess arms or had no means to purchase arms.

Thousands Ducks Fall Prey Some Unknown Disease

Thousands of wild ducks and shore birds at Maitheur lake, federal bird reserve in Harney county, have again fallen prey to an unknown disease which is rapidly diminishing their numbers, according to information received here yesterday by Ray C. Steele, U. S. game warden.

Steele was accompanied to the lake by Dr. W. H. Lytle, state veterinarian, who will assist with a thorough study of the cause of deplorable conditions at the lake. Services of a bacteriologist from the state agricultural college, were requested by Steele, and will probably be forthcoming.

Appearing about July 10, the disease struck the lake exceptionally early this year, Steele, who made a trip to the section, stated. It usually comes late in September, he said, and gave low water as the reason for its earlier advent.

Virtually nothing is known of the pestilence. It attacks the waterfowl quickly, paralyzing parts of their bodies, and is followed in a short time by death. Wild geese and land birds appear to be immune from the disease. Steele found a great number of the afflicted fowl to have leeches attached to their bodies.

The warden regards the disease as extremely serious, and deplores the fact that no government funds are provided for its study and control. The malady is periodical and appears most often in those regions where low water and alkali are to be found. Tule lake had a visitation of the disease some time ago, it was reported.

SPUD BUYER STATES CONDITION IS POOR

Jack Grafton, Corvallis potato buyer who last year purchased 39 carloads of Klamath county spuds at top prices, is not too optimistic over the potato market this fall. Grafton was in this city yesterday.

With Yukima and Idaho growers enjoying excellent crops this year, and conditions in the east and mid-west generally favorable, spud prices will not be as high as last season, he stated.
