

Portland Avenue To Be Included in Paving Program

The city engineer will draw up plans and specifications to include Portland avenue paving and sewer projects in the Pacific Terrace unit, as the result of action by the city council last night.

Instructions to the engineer grow out of the request of P. T. Henderson, of the Klamath Development company, that action on the Pacific Terrace unit be speeded up. Henderson stood the costs of preliminary surveys on the Pacific Terrace unit, to get the work underway, and last night offered to waive these if some definite action could be taken to push the unit.

The attempt to combine the two improvement projects had served to hold up action on Pacific Terrace. Henderson's desire was to get the Pacific Terrace project graded, ready for paving early next year, to avoid delay at that time.

Following the approval of the past month's bills, the council voted to pay the \$72,600 bill presented sometime ago by John Whitmer, for dumping of city garbage on his property. The council also approved the purchase of a hand roller for use in the repairing of city streets.

Among the petitions read and referred to various committees was one asking for a street light on corner of Front and Darrow streets in Mills addition; a letter was a request from the Apostolic Faith to establish a tent for church services on the corner of Pine and Eleventh. Operation permits were granted to the Loggers' Card Room and to the Glenn hotel.

House Painter to Get Million From Invention Royalty

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 7.—(United News)—Blake P. Hopkins, a house painter, has won what his attorneys describe as a final victory in his efforts to collect approximately \$1,000,000 from firms which have used a paint spraying device to which Hopkins claims patent rights.

The United States circuit court of appeals today affirmed a district court decision upholding these patent claims.

Hopkins invented the device 12 years ago and since then the sprayer has come into general use. His attorneys say that the appellate court decision will enable him to collect damages from all who have used the invention.

Woman Falls to Death as Plane Drops Into Surf

ASTORIA, Sept. 7.—(United News)—Cone inspection party today by a United News representative of the shattered airplane in which Mrs. Earl Grey fell to her death in the surf at Cannon Beach Monday showed clearly that the young woman's body is not held in the tangled framework of the fuselage. The lady, landing rear and motor of the plane were fast on a reef south of Haystack rock at low tide at 7 o'clock this morning.

Climbing over the rocks it was possible to reach the wreck which was still held fast against the reef by the surf. No trace of Mrs. Grey's body could be found and it is now generally agreed that the body is not with the remnant of the plane. A patrol is being kept on the beach in the hope that the body will drift ashore.

ROSEBURG, Sept. 7.—(United News)—The body of a man believed to be John T. Searchers were sent out from Roseburg, but failed to find him. From papers and cards on the body he is believed to be John A. Hill, 4032 17th street, San Francisco and was evidently a carpenter.
