in the middle west, is borne by the farmer.
In many cases farmers who borrowed heavily to plant their crops are seeing them completely washed away by high waters. In other localities where floods have not been a menace, the continual downpour has made the earth so soft that crops cannot be harvested.
Friday was a day of respite from rain, but the skies remained overcast and the weather bureau said that the low pressure areas which are responsible for precipitation, would continue for several days.
In Indiana, Iowa and Illinois, where the floods have caused the heaviest damage in the last few days streams were still rising. The Illinois river was above flood stage at Beardstown, and volunteers were busy re-enforcing the levees with sand bags.
The flow through the dykes at Waver, Ia., has diminished slightly after ruining more than 10,000 acres of rich farm land in the Green Bay district.
