On boat, the government tug Bagaduce, which was steaming here from Key West, State militiamen and naval reservists, on duty here, at Hollywood and other hard hit cities, to prevent looting and aid relief work.

Business and civic leaders were heartened by word that relief funds might run into the millions as the result of an appeal by President Coolidge and that government vessels laden with provisions and materials were proceeding from New York and New London.

The thousands of injured are being rapidly taken care of, although physicians and nurses have worked for great intervals without sleep. A field morgue and hospital established at Sebring has received many dead and treated close to 1,000 patients.

Police have issued passes to applicants for Red Cross bread lines, which are under supervision of martial law. Pure water has come from Jacksonville and Tampa along with medical supplies and food following the decision that city water, turned on for a while Sunday night, was not fit for consumption.

All vehicles except those having official business were turned back during the day, and it was impossible to pass the troops which patrolled the roads without police credentials. A state trooper at Miami killed one man who was prowling about a building.

City officials decided during the day that Miami was almost able to cope with her situation, and turned back some relief trains to Hollywood, where the situation was said to be more acute.

Ormiston Search Started; World Wide Is Search

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 20.—(United News)—Kenneth G. Ormiston, radio man, continued to occupy the spotlight in the Aimee Semple McPherson case as orders for his arrest were broadcast throughout the country Monday night.

Meanwhile the preparation of evidence to be presented in Judge Blake's court next Monday, when Mrs. McPherson and co-defendants will be given a preliminary hearing, is under way.

Mrs. Lorraine Wiseman, a sister of the mythical "Miss X," failed to appear in municipal court for preliminary trial today on charges of circulating fictitious checks and the case was continued until October 20, on the plea of her attorney, who said she was ill.

District Attorney Asa Keyes resumed his pre-trial investigation by questioning A. A. McGloth, whose son, H. R. Mellose, is being sought in connection with the "kidnaping."

In an affidavit the elder Mellose declared that "my son told me that the attorney had promised him that if the deal went through Mrs. McPherson would see to it that he never wanted for money."

Another witness called, Captain C. A. Brink, was understood to have corroborated points in the story by Miss Bernice Morris, secretary to Attorney R. A. McKinley.

The whereabouts of Ormiston remains a mystery but a special bulletin has been issued by the police and sent throughout the country, giving a detailed description of the radio man.

pany of Portland. Work on the buildings was started immediately, and completion was made early in June. The territory controlled by the state includes 3.26 acres purchased from Altamont Acres.

The main building, most modern in architecture, is light, airy and perfectly ventilated. The main office, stock room, machine shops and general repair shop for the trucks, are located in the larger building.

The gigantic task of maintaining 60 trucks used in maintenance work in the southern Oregon territory, is assumed by the Klamath Falls shop. Southern Oregon territory embraces that section of the state from Grants Pass south on the Pacific highway, Bend south on the Dallas-California highway and everything on the Klamath Falls-Lakeview highway and east in southern Oregon.

Trucks are regularly overhauled and in the immediate future a shed for storage of trucks will be in construction. Provision for storing the trucks includes a building 26x144 feet, according to Smith.

The second building contains a massive boiler for heating both buildings; wash rack for the trucks, and cars maintained by the southern Oregon equipment shop; a modern blacksmith shop; and locker rooms for employees.

New equipment, at a tremendous cost to the state highway department, has been installed in the machine shops, considered the most modern in the state. Two lathes, a milling machine, power hacksaw and two drill presses, have already been put into use in maintaining a few of the trucks. The forge
