FIXING THE TIME AND PLACE FOR THE HEARING OF OBJECTIONS TO THE PROPOSED ASSESSMENT ROLL MADE AND FILED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL IN THE MATTER OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE EIGHTH SEWER UNIT OF KLAMATH FALLS, OREGON, AND APPROVING THE ASSESSMENT ROLL HERETOFORE FILED HEREIN.

WHEREAS, the Common Council has made and filed in the office of the Police Judge the Proposed Assessment Roll in connection with the proposed construction of the Eighth Sewer Unit in Klamath Falls, Oregon, as more fully shown on the plans and described in the specifications of the City Engineer on file in the matter of said Eighth Sewer Unit with the said Police Judge.
