SALISBURY COUNTRY CLUB, SALISBURY PLAINS, N. Y., Sept. 21.—(United News)—James M. Barnes, Bobby Croikshank, Al Watkins, Joe Turnesa, Francis Gallett, Harry Cooper and Fred McLeod were among the stars who passed out today in the first round of match play in the professional golfers' association annual championship at the Salisbury club.

Mike Brady also had an annoying close call, being carried to the thirty-seventh hole by George Aulbach in the only extra hole contest.

Inasmuch as he has had the title two years in succession, Walter Hagen carried the largest gallery. He was three up on Joe Turnesa at 18 holes and ended three up and two to go. Hagen was credited with a 72, the second best tally for the morning round by one stroke.

Gene Sarazen and Jim Barnes had it hot and tight on their first circuit, the former ending one up, but in the afternoon Gene forged ahead, making it five up and four to go. Sarazen's total on the first round was 75 to Jim's 76.

and beyond that the extra charge is 25 cents. A new stamp designed for air mail use and costing 15 cents, was issued this month at Washington, D. C., and has made its appearance at the local postoffice.

H. S. Tharp, meeting with the transportation committee, urged that Klamath Falls take steps to secure direct air mail service here by having this city made a base for the mail planes. "This city is almost on a direct air line between Seattle and Los Angeles," Tharp pointed out, "and is the logical place for planes on this run to land, because of favorable atmospheric conditions." concentrated foods of animal origin. Dishes containing a fair amount of cheese may be said to be rich not only in protein and fat, but also in calcium and phosphorus, since these elements are contained in the milk from which cheese is made. Like any other food, however, cheese should be eaten with intelligence, and not in excess. With ordinary precautions, it may be used as any other staple food, either alone or as a part of a combination dish.

In this connection, the following dishes made with cheese should be of interest to the home manager:

Escalloped Cheese

Six slices buttered bread, two eggs three-quarters cup evaporated milk diluted with three-quarters cup water, half teaspoon salt, one-eighth teaspoon paprika, one-quarter pound grated cheese.

Cut four slices of bread into narrow strips and stand up around rim of a deep buttered baking dish. Cut the other two slices into small cubes and lay in bottom of dish. Beat the eggs thoroughly, add diluted milk and pour over bread. Add salt, paprika and grated cheese. Bake in a 325 degree F. oven until set. Serve immediately.

Cheese Bundles

Six strips cheese cut half inch thick, six thin slices dried beef, six slices toast, parsley, six slices sweet or dill pickle.

Roll each strip cheese carefully in slices of dried beef. Lay on toast and bake in hot oven until cheese melts. Garnish with parsley and pickle.

Cheese Souffle

Three tablespoons butter, four tablespoons flour, three-eighths cup evaporated milk diluted with three-eighths cup water, three-quarters cup grated cheese, half teaspoon Worcestershire sauce (may be omitted), yolks three eggs, whites three eggs, half teaspoon salt, quarter teaspoon baking powder.

Make a white sauce of butter, flour, diluted milk and salt, cooking for five minutes. Add cheese, allow it to melt so that it may be evenly blended with white sauce. Cool and add well-beaten
