Warning Is Issued Against Dishonest Gasoline Dealers

George O. Brandenberg, secretary and general manager of the Oregon State Motor association, who is almost as well known in Klamath Falls as he is in Portland, writes that the recent arrest of several service station operators in the Rose City, who are charged with substitution of cheap, inferior oils in place of the standard brands asked for, has aroused the Motor association again to send out warnings against "cyp" organizations.

The A. A. A., said Mr. Brandenberg, is constantly waging war on the dishonest garagemen and service station proprietors who have found it an easy matter to make the substitution. The Oregon State Motor association, which holds the franchise of the A. A. A. on this state, has sent out bulletins on several occasions warning the public to be on guard for oil substitution crooks.

Mr. Brandenberg adds that this does not mean that all are dishonest, for the honest dealer is a great majority.

DEMPSEY STILL POSSESSES FAITH IN HIS ABILITY ATLANTIC CITY, Sept. 25.—(United Press)—Jack Dempsey hasn't lost faith in himself.

The blows which Gene Tunney rained upon the head and body of the Maunassa Mauler Thursday night robbed him of his world's heavyweight championship, stung him into virtual helplessness, but did not deprive him of the confidence that he can beat any other man in the limits of the prize ring.

"I'll fight Tunney again next week if it suits him," Dempsey told the United Press this afternoon. "Let him say at once and I'll begin roadwork at the word."

Those words shot out spiritedly. It was the Dempsey of five years ago who spoke.
