

S. P. Trainmen To Make Homes In This City

The so-called division point of the Southern Pacific at Crescent Lake will do no damage to Klamath Falls, according to a letter received by the chamber of commerce from J. H. Dyer, general manager. In fact, it is generally agreed by the board of directors of the chamber that it will work as a boomerang for the advancement of this city by reason of the fact that most trainmen will reside here.

Crescent Lake will have a two-stall round house and Klamath Falls a ten-stall roundhouse, and trainmen will naturally double back from Crescent Lake, eventually to reside over-night in this city.

The fact that several trainmen have already purchased homes in this city is sufficient proof that the Southern Pacific has no intention of cutting this city from its map, and the letter from General Manager Dyer, which follows, is self-explanatory:

"Careful consideration was given to the division of the mileage on the new Cascade line between Shasta and Portland divisions, in conjunction with establishment of intermediate terminals that would provide satisfactory tour of service for both freight and passenger crews. To have fixed the division point at Klamath Falls would have allotted an unwarranted percentage of new available mileage to the Portland division, which already possessed a great deal more mileage than the Shasta division, and would have upset the equalization of aggregate mileage between the divisions as is desirable in railroad operation.

"The expenditures which are being made in connection with the terminal at Crescent Lake are much less than those at Klamath Falls. For instance, we are providing a two-stall engine house at Crescent Lake, as against a ten-stall engine

house with facilities in proportion at Klamath Falls.

"We desire to cooperate in every possible way in the development of Klamath Falls and our plans of serving the territory and predicated upon according to service that will be satisfactory in every direction."

Highway Bureau Is Taken Over by Outside People

Ben H. Stevenson, who has been serving as temporary manager of the Southern Oregon Tourist Bureau at the request of bureau members, announced yesterday that he had succeeded in finding capable people, financially able to properly develop the tourist bureau at the junction of the Klamath Falls-Ashland and Pacific highways.

Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Miller and Mr. and Mrs. George H. Stevenson, have signed a lease with the bureau members and have agreed to erect cottages at once.

The new managers are laying plans to make the Southern Oregon Tourist Bureau one of the best information bureaus, well stocked with data on the great Klamath country, and one of the most finished and complete auto camps in southern Oregon.

Both Miller and Stevenson have had previous experience in similar lines of hotel management. At one time, for a period of 10 years, Stevenson managed the Hotel Northern at Ely, Nevada, then owned by Tex Rickard, famous fight promoter. Miller has been identified with hotels throughout Nevada for a number of years.

Mr. and Mrs. Stevenson and daughter, Dixie Elaine, were in Klamath Falls yesterday visiting friends.

According to Ben H. Stevenson, he and his wife and daughter are planning a long vacation trip along the Pacific coast before settling down for the winter.

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Supreme Court Is Lenient; Grants Way New Trial

SALEM, Oct. 12.—(United News)—George Frank Way, Klamath county sheepraiser convicted of manslaughter under an indictment charging him with the murder of Timothy T. Murphy, another sheepman, was granted a new trial by the state supreme court here today.

Reversal of the decree of the circuit court of Klamath county was based on his refusal to include in his instructions to the jury portions of the statutes relative to excusable homicide.

Murphy's death followed a fight with Way, who claims that he used only his fists in knocking Murphy down, denying the use of his pistol.



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ANCHORAGE OBJECTS REMOVAL BARRACKS
