Kid McCoy Must Serve 24 Years In State Prison

SAN QUENTIN, Cal., Nov. 20.—(United News)—Norman Selby, the "Kid McCoy" of a past day in pugilism, must serve 24 years for the slaying of Mrs. Teresa Mors.

Selby was received at San Quentin as a prisoner slightly more than one year ago, under an indeterminate sentence of from 4 to 35 years.

Manslaughter, ten years; assault to commit murder, seven years; robbery, seven years; assault to do great bodily harm, six years.

Selby winced under the sentence which he termed "the stiffest jolt I've ever taken on the shingle."

Selby was convicted of killing Mrs. Mors, with whom he had been living two years ago in Los Angeles.

The former pugilist is 53 years old. He said he does not expect to live to complete his sentence.

THE WINTER SHINGLE ASSUMES A DRESS-FOR-DINNER DIGNITY

With the tang of fall in the air and winter close at hand the ubiquitous summer shingle is becoming passé.

Elaborate gowns invariably suggest elaborate coiffures and, although the shingle still persists, more or less severe in tone, even for evening, it is a shingle slightly more dignified to fit in with the formality of the winter festivities.

Although the winter shingle will still be a shingle it will bear little or no relation to its summer counterpart.

Briefly, the styles to be seen will number six.

1. The brushed-to-the-front shingle—hair worn quite short and side-parted, the longer hair brushed toward the forehead, the short hair brushed to the front instead of the side.

2. The classic shingle—hair cut so that it lengthens gradually from the points on the cheek to a point on the nape of the neck.

3. The raggedy shingle—straggling ends over the forehead, the whole hair loosely waved and standing softly on end.

4. Joan of Arc variation—deep bang cut long at the center front, shortening gradually toward the sides until it reaches the temples.

5. Upstanding wave shingle—hair cut short and waved at the front only.

6. Modified shingle—worn long enough to wave over the forehead and ears. The wave gives a softening line to mature features.
