

Drys Lose Contest in First Skirmish

Appropriation to Carry Forward Undercover Work by Sleuths Defeated by Tactics.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10, (U.N.)—In the first prohibition fight of the session in the house today, wets succeeded in knocking out on technicality an appropriation of \$500,000 in the treasury supply bill for hiring undercover agents.

This was the only successful move of several made by wets to kill enforcement appropriations. Their activity today opened a general offensive against prohibition legislation that will spread to the senate later and is expected to occupy much time and attention during the session.

The old familiar figures of previous wet and dry fights were back on the stage today—Upshaw, Georgia democrat, and dry leader, and Hill, Maryland, republican and wet leader. Neither will return next session.

Alienation Suit May be Settled

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 10.—(U.N.) Suit to collect \$200,000 from Corliss Palmer Brewster, Georgia beauty contest winner, which was brought by Eleanor Brewster, on grounds of alienation of affections, may be settled out of court, it was intimated here late today.

Corliss Palmer, as she is known in movie circles, was to have appeared in superior court to file a deposition in answer to the brief filed by attorneys for the first Mrs. Brewster, and seeking to have the judgment awarded in New York transferred to Los Angeles.

Tangled Relations Chaplins Unsolved

HOLLYWOOD, Calif., Dec. 10.—(United News)—Another conference between attorneys for Charles Chaplin and his wife failed to materialize Friday, but it was announced that opposing counsel will meet Saturday without fail in an effort to smooth out the tangled marital relations of the famous couple.

If there is the slightest indication that an effort will be made to deprive Mrs. Chaplin of custody of the two children, conferences and peace overtures will be discontinued, counsel for Mrs. Chaplin declared.

Mine Explosion Toll Reaches 28

PRINCETON, Ind., Dec. 10, (U.N.)—Twenty-eight miners were killed by the explosion Thursday morning in Francisco mine number two, according to a final casualty list issued Friday.

Another explosion Friday, followed by fire, forced abandonment of further attempts to locate five miners who were left in the mine.

Twenty-one bodies had been brought out, while two of the injured died Friday in the Princeton hospital.

It may be a month or more before the coal mine can be unsealed and explored for the rest of the bodies, officials said. The mine was sealed after a conference with W. G. Powell, federal mine inspector.

Youngest Inmate Of Pen Received

SAN RAFAEL, Cal., Dec. 10, (U.N.)—A 15-year old boy, with a confessed record of crime that includes eight holdups has met defeat in his first effort to escape from his position as San Quentin penitentiary's youngest prisoner.

Joseph Taffey, alias Joseph Tasey, alias James Troutman, was sentenced from Sacramento after a series of robberies. Superior Judge Edward I. Butler today denied the youth's plea that the court which sentenced him had gone outside its jurisdiction in imposing a term of from five years to life imprisonment.

The plea was entered by Miss Valla Parkinson, Sacramento attorney.

CANTON, O., Dec. 10, (U.N.)—Ten men and three women are on the jury that will begin hearing evidence Monday in the Mellett murder trial.

One of the women is a "thirteenth juror," who will sit with the 12 regular jurors, but will not have a vote in the final balloting, unless one of the regulars becomes incapacitated.
