SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 20, (U.N.)—Refusal of the Oregon Trunk railroad to accept use of Southern Pacific tracks from Paunina to Klamath Falls, Ore., has again put the question of southern Oregon railroad development up to the interstate commerce commission.

The interstate commerce commission previously, in considering the Oregon Trunk application for extension of its line from Bend to Klamath Falls, recommended the securing of rights for joint use of the track with the Southern Pacific, where the two lines would be parallel.
