SOLDIERS DISCOVER FORCIBLE KISSING OF GIRLS SERIOUS

OMAHA, Dec. 21, (U.S.)—Found guilty by a courtmartial of forcibly kissing four girls at Bellevue, Neb., O'Dell Malone, 21, and Otto Shafer, 20, privates in the United States army at Fort Crook, tonight faced ten year sentences at the military prison at Fort Leavenworth.

This was the sentence recommended by the trial. The recommendation will be reviewed by Major General J. B. Poor, who has the power to cut the sentence to two years.

Malone and Shafer were found guilty of bringing disgrace on the army by their actions.
