PROCLAMATION BY MAYOR

I, Fred R. Goddard, Mayor of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, by virtue of the authority in me vested by Ordinance 554, filed in the office of the Police Judge of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, on July 15, 1921, entitled "An Ordinance providing for the manner of exercising in the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, the initiative and referendum powers reserved to the legal voters of municipalities by Section 1 and Section 1-a of Article IV of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, and to enact and amend their municipal charters reserved to the legal voters of cities and towns by Section 2 of Article XI of the Constitution of the State of Oregon," do hereby proclaim that Ordinance Number 523, duly adopted by the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, on November 15, 1926, and entitled: "An ordinance providing for submission to the legal voters of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, the question of authorizing the Common Council to exercise its taxing power to the extent of raising a greater amount of revenue, for purposes other than the payment of bonded indebtedness and interest thereon, than the total amount levied by such council for the preceding fiscal year plus six per cent thereof, and declaring an emergency," and referred to the people by the initiative process, received the requisite majority vote, to-wit: 241 affirmative votes for ballot title "300 Yes"; the negative vote, or the vote against the same, being "301 No"; being 60; and 252 affirmative votes for ballot title "302 Yes"; the negative vote, or the vote against the same, being "303 No," being 45; and the said Ordinance thereby became and was adopted by the people of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, and I do hereby proclaim the same as having been adopted.

I, the mayor, hereby further proclaim that the said proposed initiative measures, amendments, and the like, as hereinbefore listed, received the requisite number of votes to pass, carry and adopt the same. That the said measures having received a majority of all the votes cast at said election held on December 21, 1926, and it appearing from the canvass of such votes that they received a majority of affirmative votes, I the Mayor, aforesaid, hereby proclaim that said initiative and other measures have been duly adopted by the qualified voters and electors of the city of Klamath Falls, Oregon.

Witness my hand and the seal of said City this 30th day of December, 1926.

SCIENTIFIC POLICE HEAD TO LEAVE DETROIT SOON

BERKELEY, Calif., Dec. 30, (U.N.)—August Vollmer, scientific criminologist, having declined offers to continue his survey of crime conditions in Detroit, which he terms a city less wicked than revised, will return in January to resume his duties as Berkeley's chief of police.

"There is enough work here to keep me busy for another year," Vollmer wrote to his acting chief, "but despite flattering offers made to me, I have told them I would be on my way."

Vollmer said he has not found conditions in Detroit to bear out the unfavorable findings of the Rockefeller Foundation crime survey. Vollmer was retained by the city as a result of this survey, which termed Detroit "the wickedest city in the United States."
