

Postal Shipments Baby Chicks Here

Early arrival of baby chicks at the local post office, forecast even heavier shipments this spring than has been the case in previous years when as many as 2,000 chicks in one day have been received here, according to Postmaster John A. McCall who yesterday stated that two shipments have already been made.

Consigned to Malin and Merrill, the two shipments from Salem comprised over 100 baby chicks, McCall stated, and come several months early, as the first shipping is usually done early in April.

"If the shipments continue to arrive here at this season and continue through April and May, when they usually come here, this year should certainly be a big one for poultry in Klamath county," the postmaster stated. Last year when nearly 100,000 baby chicks were received at the post office, was the heaviest for this cargo in the history of the local post office.

City is Housing More Prisoners

Postmaster John McCall today posted notices from Washington, D. C., calling for applicants for the Worden post office which was recently discontinued due to lack of business and the resignation of the former postmaster there.

"The postal department has already received one application for the job," McCall said, "and this notice indicates that the Worden post office will be reestablished."

When the former postmaster resigned because he was unable to make a living in the position, according to his word to McCall at the time, no others signified their intention of wanting the job.

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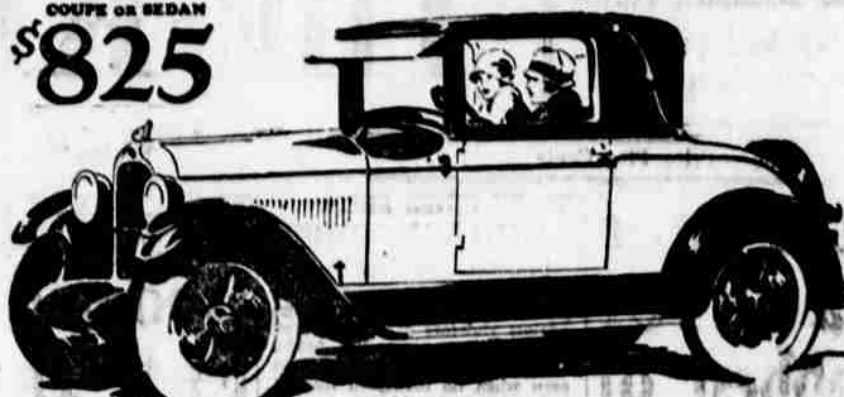


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**MEDICS WORKING TO
