

Flyweight Champ Labarba Defeated

BOSTON, Mass., March 21. (U. N.)—The flying fists of Fidel Labarba, world's flyweight champion, were unable to stem the rush of victory flushed Johnny Vacca of Brighton, who was awarded the decision after ten rounds of hectic fighting here tonight.

Vacca, who floored the champion four times in their last match demonstrated clearly that he held no fear of Labarba. He fought as Labarba fought, slugged when Labarba slugged and evened things up when the champion elected to fight his favorite way—inside.

Vacca took six of the ten rounds, Labarba got two, while the other two were declared even.

The first two rounds saw both fighters sizing each other up and taking it easy. Labarba was in no hurry to run into the fists that had floored him before.

Vacca was cautious in spite of the knowledge that he had beaten this man before.

The third round saw Labarba speed up a bit. He pushed Vacca somewhat, and got in enough blows to win the round.

French In Danger
A line extended from the extreme southern boundary of the city to the Bund and this separated the Cantonese from the French concession which would be the first place attacked if the troops attempted to cross into foreign controlled territory.

Along the southern section of this line planks have been removed from bridges opening into the French concession and barbed wire entanglements and machine guns are in place while sandbags have been piled in front of buildings.

Further along, progressing toward the Bund and the section where vast foreign business interests are located are eight-foot picket iron gates with concrete frames. Soldiers stand back of them. This constitutes what has been called the first line of defense. A second and third line have been established and foreign soldiers have been trained to man these if necessity arises.

The international settlement is back of the French concession and chief attempts to afford protection have been made there.

British Soldiers Wounded
Lieut. Newman of the British forces and three of the other British soldiers wounded, clashed with the Cantonese when the latter attempted to rush a Punjabi Indian detachment holding a post on Darroch road, near the settlement.

The Cantonese, who were civilian clothes, wounded two Punjabis before Lieut. Newman and the other British soldiers arrived in an armored car. It was not by firing from nearby houses and was disabled. The car returned the fire until another one arrived and carried away the wounded.

French Are Active

The French are at the southern and southwestern side of the French concession; a British border regiment is spread out westward to the railway and north to Jesfield park; the Coldstream Guards are on the northwest while the Durham regiment is stationed along Soochow creek by the international settlement and northward to the railway station; the Japanese cover the central and northern part at Hongkew park; the Punjabi Indian units are scattered along the northern side and the Italian troops are spread eastward to the Whangpoo river, while the Spanish and Dutch forces are along the river on the other side of the settlement at the place where it joins the Chinese native city. The American forces are occupying a position back of the Coldstream Guards.

Only one foreigner, a Punjabi soldier from British India, has been killed. Four British soldiers, four Punjabis, one Sikh, three special policemen, one Japanese and one British Indian policeman were wounded.

Many Fires Raging
Fires were raging in the native quarter this morning. Damage of the flames spreading to the settlement increased.

Insurance of 500 revolvers by the general labor union resulted in the killing of three Chinese. Those firing were laborers seeking to avenge the beheading of a score of agitators during the general strike several weeks ago.

Complete domination by the Cantonese of the area around Shanghai seemed assured when the United States marine intelligence service learned that the northern troops were evacuating Nanking and that the nationalists were taking over that section at their pleasure.

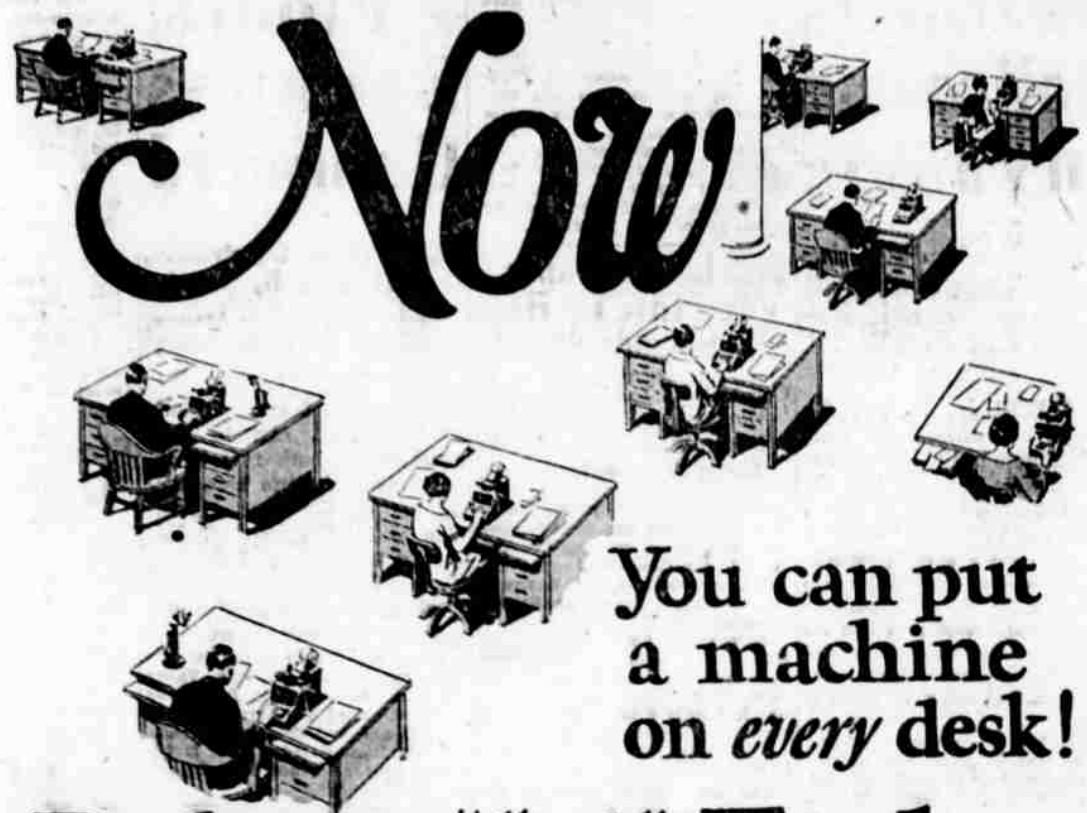
