MALIN AND SHASTA VIEW

(By MRS. PETER FISHER) News Correspondent

The Malin Cheese and Produce company was organized and incorporated June 29, 1921, by a group of progressive farmers and business men of Malin and surrounding district. The object of organizing the cheese factory was to create a cash and sure market for the alfalfa hay produced in this district. The company was capitalized for \$6,000, divided into 120 shares of \$50 a share, as many shares as possible being sold, the building was started on machinery bought on November 8, the same year the factory was opened for business with 1200 pounds of milk the first day, which increased from that until the fifth season of May and June, 1926, when over 14,000 pounds a day was received at the time the factory was organized. The board of directors then elected was: Harry E. Wilson, president; V. J. Spolek, vice-president; E. D. Smith, W. A. Macken and V. J. Spolek directors. The board of directors is still the same with the exception of W. A. Macken, who resigned and took up business in Klamath Falls. In place of Mr. Macken, C. M. Kirkpatrick was elected.

The main trouble for the company is financial, not enough funds have been available for equipment to keep up with the increase of business. At one time the limit was borrowed from the Malin State bank and the five directors put their names to a note for \$1,000. But for the past year all has been clear of indebtedness.

Next month construction for cold storage rooms will be started, and also a \$3,000 ice machine, and butter making machinery is to be installed, so that both butter and cheese can be made and handled if the conditions of market justifies.

The last two years dividends have been paid of \$4.00 per share. The shares have been increased to \$61.50 and at the last stockholders meeting which was held in February, 1927, the price of the remaining unsold shares was set at \$75.00 a share. Twenty-five of those shares were subscribed for at that meeting.

Mr. Reber's slogan is: "We try to treat the farmers square." "We lost patrons, some for a while, some for good; we gained new patrons, some swear by us, and some at us. We guess it's part of the game," he stated.
