DURANT, Okla., April 20, (U.P.)—Sixty homes were demolished and a woman injured at Caddo, Okla., 15 miles northeast of here late this afternoon, when a cyclone struck the town.

No deaths had been reported at 7:30 o'clock tonight. The woman, Mrs. J. W. Overstreet, was not seriously hurt. Caddo is approximately 50 miles southwest of the territory near Hugo, Okla., where eleven persons lost their lives in a tornado last night.
