HERE'S A FRIENDLY TIP AS TO WHAT'S BEST IN WOODS

When in the woods it is best not to smoke or start a fire; but if you must, save your smoke until you can sit down by a creek and knock your ashes into the water. Build your camp fire in an open place, or in the trail, or on a gravel bar. Build it where there is no fuel it can spread to, either on top of the ground or under the surface. An old roof will burn for weeks and carry a fire for many feet. Never leave your camp fire unattended, even for a few minutes. Every year campers do that, and some of them start forest fires and burn up their camp outfits as well.

In town there is no especial need for starting a conflagration. Cooking and heating are done by stoves; cigar butts are put into ash trays or thrown onto a concrete sidewalk or a watered lawn. In the woods there is no place to put a fire but on the ground that is covered, in most cases, with great quantities of dry fuel. It is just as easy to start a fire in the woods as it is to start a fire in a box of crackers. So remember where you are and take no chances.

Fight Pictures May Bring Indictments

BELLEVILLE, Wash., May 29, (U.P.)—According to a letter received here from one of the high officials of the United States Law Enforcement Branch, the Bureau of Investigation Department of Justice is gathering information upon which indictments might be sought of those responsible for showing in this state pictures taken of the Dempsey-Tunney championship fight.

The letter points out that the aggregate penalties for this violation is three years in the penitentiary and fines totalling eleven thousand dollars. Fight pictures were shown here Saturday and Sunday despite angry protests of local religious and law enforcement groups.

foreign, officials have said. They are uncertain as to whether the British action will arouse more antagonism in Egypt or serve to quell that already apparent.

This step by Great Britain follows severance of diplomatic relations with Soviet Russia last week, a result of a raid on the Anglo house, headquarters for the Soviet trade delegation in London, during which it was revealed, according to officials, that Soviet agents had been issuing propaganda from this establishment.

OLD FOLKS TO GO TO THIS SCHOOL IN WALES

LONDON, May 29.—Establishment of the first residential college for adult education in Wales is made possible by the gift by a South Wales industrial leader of a large building located at Harlech. The building will furnish dormitory accommodations for thirty students. It has a good library, lecture rooms and dining hall, and an excellent music hall seating 300 persons, with a fine organ.

The governing body will be composed of representatives of different organizations in Wales interested in adult education, with Lord Haldane as the first president. Activities of the college will probably be limited at first to summer schools, short-term courses and institutes for tutors, or extension courses for adults, for which there is a growing demand.
