Pursuant to Ordinance No. 905 of the City of Klamath Falls, Ore., notice is hereby given that bids will be received by the Police Judge of said City at his office in the City Hall, up to and including Wednesday, June 15, 1927, at 8 o'clock P. M. for making the proposed improvement of Sixth street from the west line of Commercial street, extended, to the west line of the railroad property or right of way of the Southern Pacific Company.

Said improvement shall consist of paving said portions of said street by placing thereon eight-inch cement concrete pavement or seven-inch vibroblite pavement, including ordinary grading, combination concrete curb and gutter, special concrete sidewalk, headers, concrete steps, drain tile, safety island, storm sewer system, monument frames and covers, special concrete, crushed rock filling, sanitary sewer system; by placing thereon special warrenite bituminous pavement, two-inch bituminous concrete base and including ordinary grading, combination concrete curb and gutter, special concrete sidewalks, headers, concrete steps, drain tile, safety island, storm sewer system; by placing thereon special asphaltic concrete pavement, two-inch top on six inch bituminous base and including ordinary grading, combination concrete curb and gutter, special concrete sidewalk, headers, concrete steps, drain tile, safety island, storm sewer system, monument frames and covers, special concrete, crushed rock filling and sanitary sewer system, all in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates filed herein and to which reference is hereby made.

Said improvement will be let in

one contract and bids will be received for each kind of pavement specified above, and will be opened for consideration by the Common Council on the said 15th day of June, 1927, at the hour of 8 o'clock P. M. Bidders will be required to submit bids on blanks prepared by the City Engineer, and bids will not be considered unless so submitted. Bids for bids may be obtained at the office of the City Engineer in the City Hall.

The successful bidder will be required to give bond in a sum to be fixed by the Common Council for the faithful performance of the contract to be entered into for making said improvement. Each bid must be accompanied by a check certified by some responsible bank

for five (5) per cent of the amount bid, as a guarantee that the successful bidder will enter into contract with the City for making of such improvement within ten (10) days from the date of making such award.

The Common Council reserves the right to reject any and all bids, and to make such improvement on behalf of the City.
