RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

FIXING THE TIME AND PLACE FOR HEARING OBJECTIONS AND REMONSTRANCES TO THE IMPROVEMENT OF LOOKOUT AVENUE FROM THE NORTH LINE OF UPHAM STREET TO THE SOUTH LINE OF ST. FRANCIS STREET INCLUDING INTERSECTIONS, THE SAME BEING KNOWN AS IMPROVEMENT UNIT NO. 73.

The City Engineer, pursuant to resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having on the 20th day of June, 1927, filed plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of improving Lookout avenue from the north line of Upham street to the south line of St. Francis street, including intersections, the same being Unit No. 73, and the Council having taken the same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of the said portions of said streets, being the specifications and estimates attached to the plans and estimates filed herein on June 20th, 1927, be, and the same are hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of said street with Type "A" Warrenite-Bitumastic pavement at an estimated cost of \$14,000.00, or Type "A" Asphaltic Concrete pavement at an estimated cost of \$13,665.63, or with Cement Concrete pavement six inches thick at an estimated cost of \$14,225.63, or with Vitrolithic pavement six inches thick at an estimated cost of \$14,225.63, said improvement in either event to include grading the street to the proper sub-grade, laying 4-foot concrete sidewalk on each side, building concrete steps and dry rock walls where needed, laying any sanitary sewer needed to complete the service, building any storm sewers needed, putting in sidewalk, drain pipe and headers where necessary, constructing combination concrete curb and gutter on the portion south of the south line of Fulton street and special single curb north of same; laying an appropriate hard surface pavement in the roadway south of south line of Fulton street and crushed rock macadam north of same.
