MARTIN STREET FROM THE NORTH LINE OF HOME AVENUE TO THE NORTHWESTERLY LINE OF LOT 37 IN BLOCK 17 AND LOT 26 IN BLOCK 22 OF INDUSTRIAL ADDITION, KNOWN AS IMPROVEMENT UNIT NO. 74.

The City Engineer, pursuant to resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having on the 18th day of July, 1927, filed plans, specifications and estimates of cost of improving Martin street from the north line of Home avenue to the northeasterly line of lot 27 in block 17 and lot 26 in block 22 of Industrial Addition, known as Improvement Unit No. 74, and the Council having taken the same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory:

NEW CITY OF DEAD FOUND IN UKRAINE

KITCHKASS, Ukraine, July 22.—(A.P.)—A hill in the neighborhood of Kitchkass, where a great hydraulic station is being constructed, has yielded what is declared to be the European counterpart of Karakofa, the "City of the Dead." The latter was discovered some years ago by the Russian explorer, Colonel Kozloff, in Mongolia. Ancient tombs in which he buried apparently important personages of the bronze and stone ages have been found, as well as numerous prehistoric graves containing relics of those ages. Above any graves believed to belong to the Scythian period, and still higher, coffins of Huns, of the Attila period. The topmost stratum reveals bones and objects apparently pertaining to the Zaporozjak Cossacks, an independent organization of bold plunderers of the 16th and 17th centuries.

EXPERIMENTERS SEEK PERFECT WATERMELON

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., July 22.—(A.P.)—A quest for the perfect watermelon is nearing its conclusion in the division of plant industry of the Illinois department of agriculture. The paragon of watermelons must have delicious flavor, be of marketable size, shape and conformation, with a rind which will withstand the strain of shipping, and it must have stamina to resist the disease known as watermelon wilt. After several seasons of experiment experts have produced melons sweet enough, sound enough and of the right shape, but the only melon which resists wilt is a round one, and the public wants its watermelons elongated. The wilt-proof varieties is being crossed again with other varieties.
