The Storm King fire in Olympic forest was slowed down, but not stopped, by the showers. Reports on other Washington fires had not been received this morning.

Mount Baker and Chelan forests and parts of Wenatchee and Snoqualmie forests in Washington reported good rains. Olympia had showers. Parts of Mt. Hood forest were well soaked, while others were untouched by the rains which dampened Portland lawns and gardens.

The fire weather forecast for Oregon today said "humidity near or above normal with fog near the coast, and northwest or west winds." There is a possibility of showers, the weather man said.

About 23,680 acres on Barlow and Badger creeks southeast of Mt. Hood in Mt. Hood national forest were closed to all persons except by permit yesterday.

PORTLAND, Aug. 12. (AP)—Bright sunshine today followed a rainstorm late yesterday which registered a precipitation of 1.9 inches. The shower was the first since July 3 and ended a warm spell of 19 days, during which temperatures ranged higher than 80 degrees. The rain was general over western Washington and northwestern Oregon.

GRANTS PASS, Aug. 12. (AP)—The hot weather, which has gripped the Rogue River valley for the past three weeks was broken late yesterday when rain visited various parts of the valley. A fairly heavy downpour was reported at Gold Hill. Yesterday's maximum temperature was 86 degrees.
