PORTLAND, Oct. 3. (UP)—Former Secretary of State Charles Hughes and Secretary of Commerce Herbert Hoover "are the foremost men in the Republican party and are by far the most popular with the people," Senator Reed Smoot, Utah Republican, said here Monday. The senator also declared he is in favor of reducing the public debt as quickly as it can be done within reason. He is advocating a reduction in the wartime revenue tax burden of 1 1/2 per cent carried by corporations in the United States and a lessening of the income tax.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 2.
